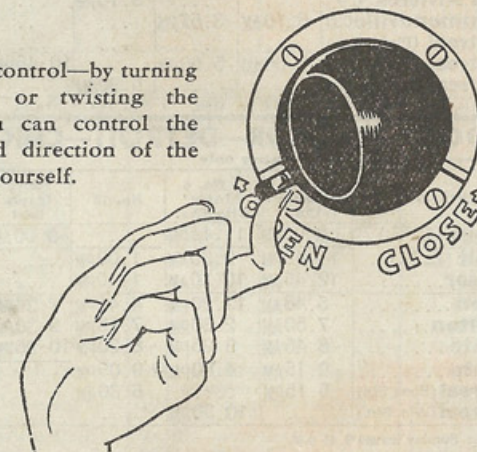

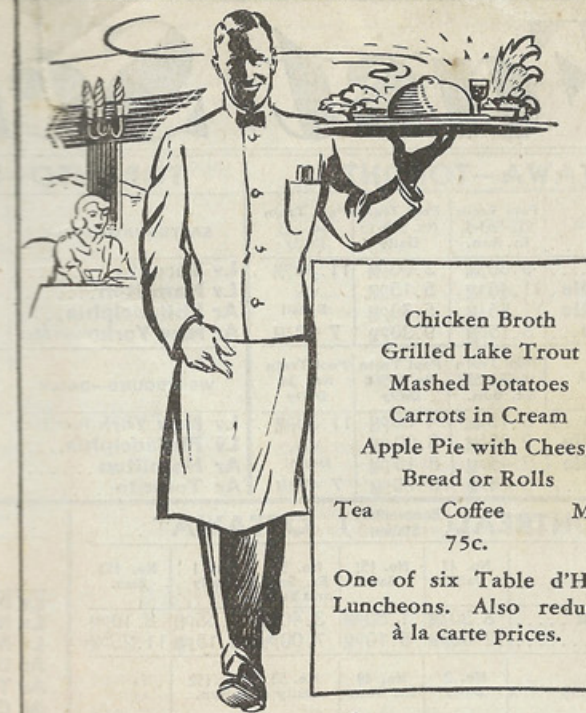

Two persons of same party travelling together and boarding car at same station will be allowed to occupy a berth on one berth ticket, one section on single occupancy section ticket, two sections on double occupancy section ticket, four a compartment on one compartment ticket and six a drawing-room on one drawing-room ticket, provided each person presents proper railway tickets.

Two persons in section (lower berth only prepared for night occupancy) the charge is equivalent to lower berth fare plus 60%. Between stations in Canada the charge for single bedrooms when occupied by one or more persons will be the same as for two lower berths for other than sleeping cars. For other sleeping cars the charge for single bedrooms runs the rate quoted for double bedrooms applies.

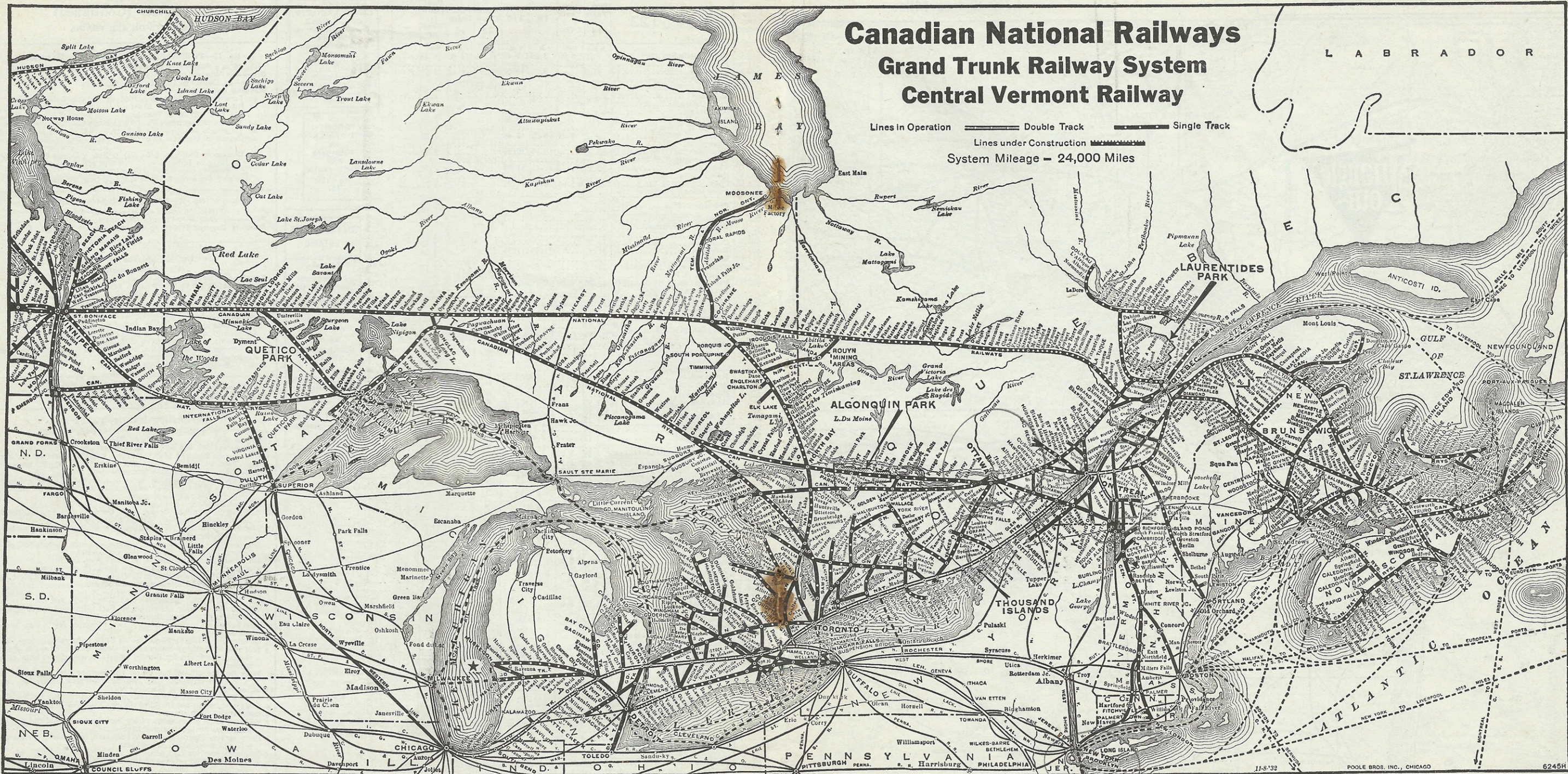

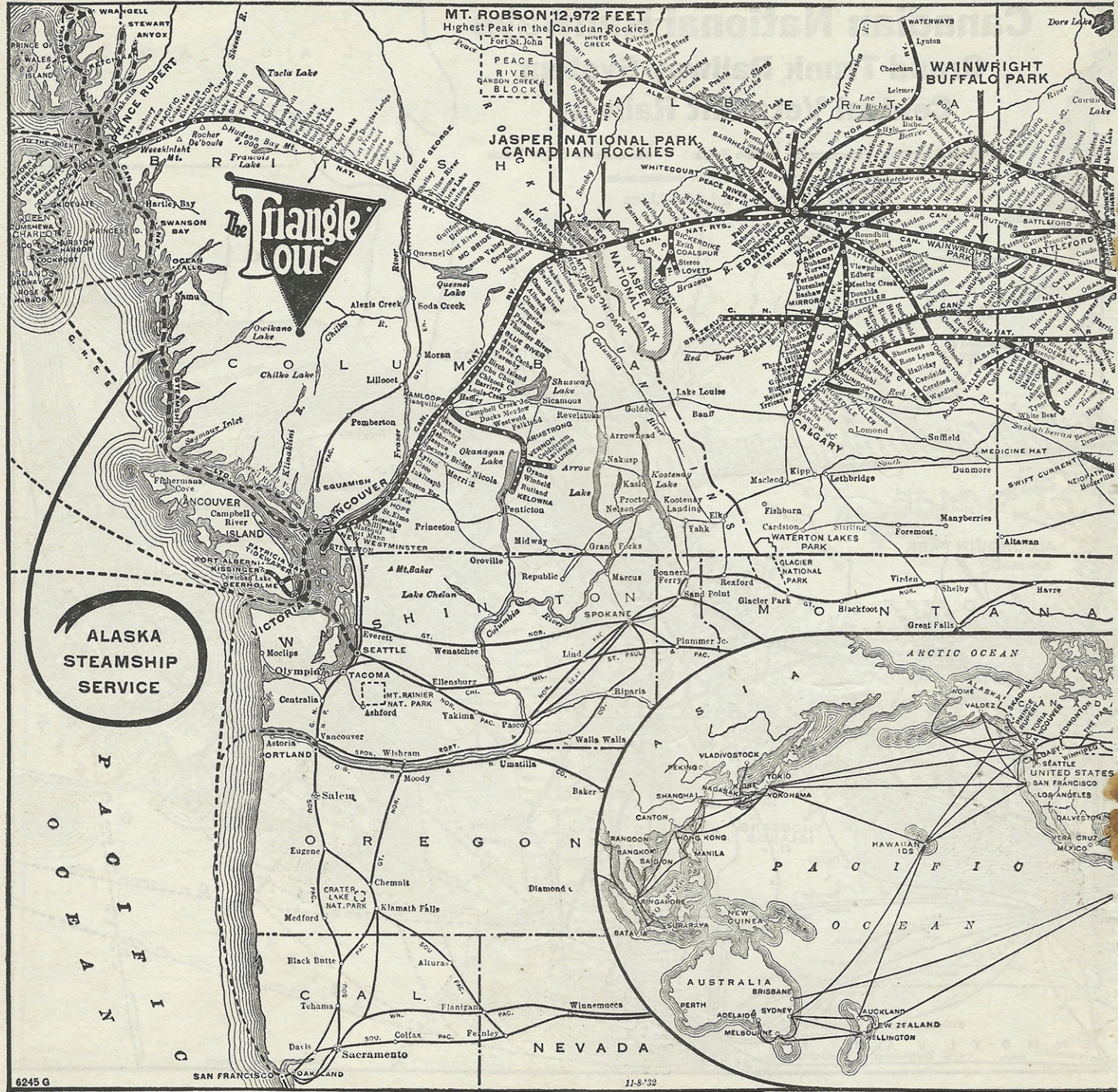

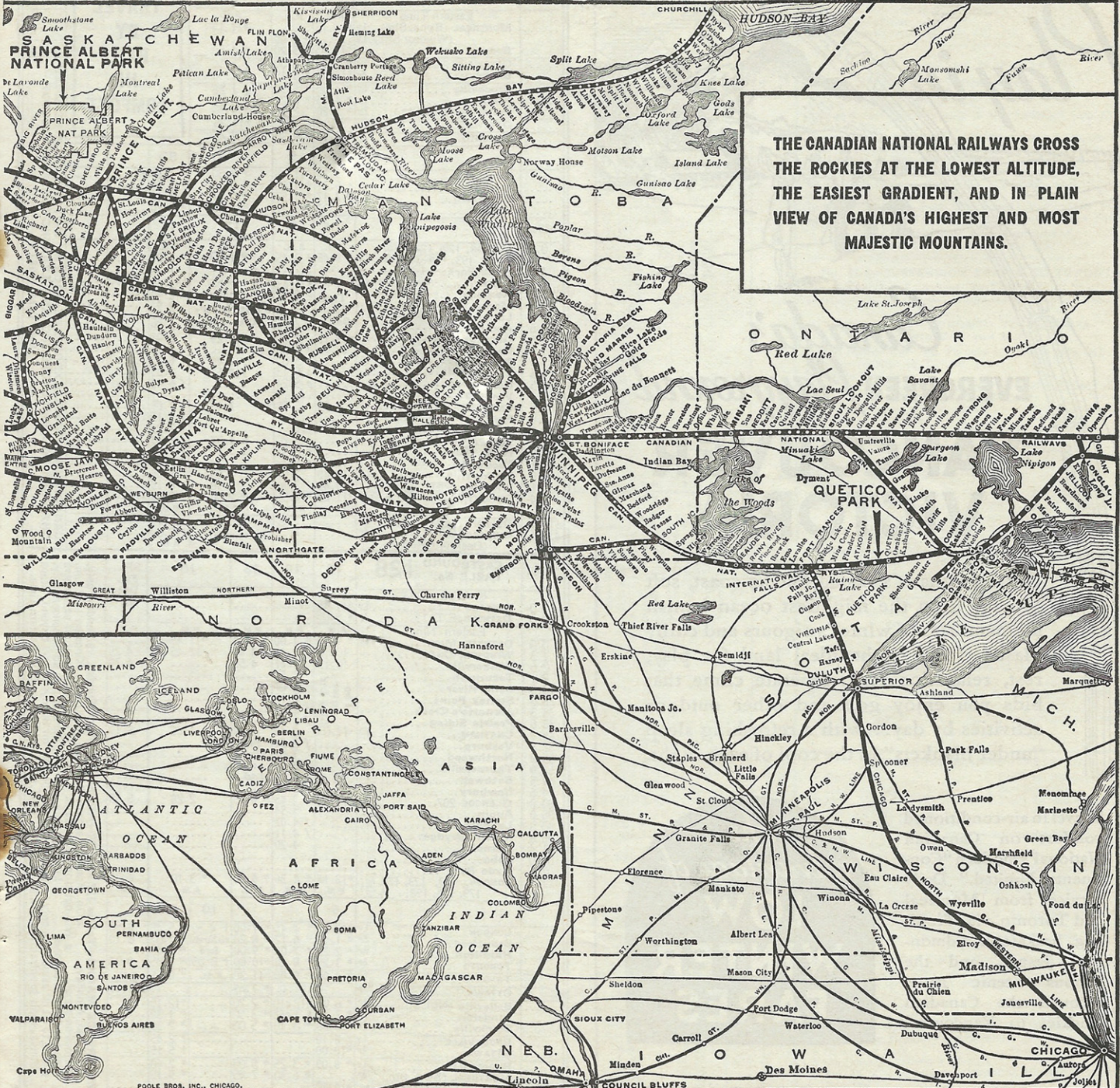

Tickets will be sold and Baggage checked only to stations at which trains are scheduled to stop.

TIME—Light-faced type denotes time from 12.01 a.m. (midnight) to 12.00 a.m. (noon), heavy-faced type denotes time from 12.01 p.m. (noon) to 12.00 p.m. (midnight).

Children, five years of age and under twelve, half fare. Under five years of age when accompanied by parent or guardian free.

Lost Tickets.—Railway Companies are not responsible for lost tickets.

Fares cannot be Adjusted by Conductors.—In the event of disagreement with Conductor relative to tickets, privileges allowed, etc., passengers should pay Conductor, take his receipt and refer the case to General Passenger Department for adjustment.

Bagages enregistrés pour les stations d'arrêt sur signal.—Lorsqu'il n'y a pas d'agent à la station d'arrivée on doit réclamer ses bagages au fourgon avant l'arrivée.

Des frais de stationnement seront perçus sur toute pièce de bagages laissée à la consigne au-delà du temps réglementaire.

Les Chiens sont transportés dans le fourgon à bagages d'après le tarif en cours. Ils doivent être bien muselés et porter un collier ou un harnais ajusté et fort, ainsi qu'une chaîne ou une laisse solide, ou alors être placés dans une caisse à claire-voie. Les petits chiens, les petits chats et les autres petits animaux (qui ont ni vice, ni odeur, et ne sont pas inadmissibles pour d'autres causes) lorsque dans un panier ou autrement enfermé, peuvent être emportés par le voyageur avec ses autres bagages à main dans le compartiment, la cabine ou la chambrette qu'il a louée.

Les objets laissés dans les trains doivent être réclamés de l'agent général des bagages le plus près.

Les malles d'échantillons des voyageurs de commerce ne sont pas enregistrées pour ou de Sunnyside, Ont.

Matériel et décors de théâtre.—La Compagnie ne garantit pas de les transporter dans le même train que les acteurs, mais se réserve le droit de les expédier par le premier train à sa convenance.

Il est illégal de transporter dans de bagages enregistrés ou à main des matières inflammables, explosives ou autrement dangereuses.

Les dimanches et les jours fériés aux E.-U. { Montréal, de 7h30 à 10h30 du matin; de 5 h. à 11 h. du soir.

Dans tous les autres cas le dédouanement s'effectue à la frontière.
